



What is IRP?

Governor's Directive 21-005, May 1, 2021

- 1.(b) The purpose of the Coordinator and the IR Program is to aid the Governor and the government of the Commonwealth in executing "designated federal grant funded projects."
- 2.(c) In tracking the progress of the designated federal grant funded projects, the Coordinator and the IR Program shall <u>determine when</u> and where any obstacles to the expeditious execution of the projects is occurring, investigate and determine their cause, and coordinate or assist the agencies as necessary in overcoming the obstacles.
